Our training, experience, strategy, and the preparedness of ourselves and our equipment is how we manage risk and achieve mission success.

People Matter - We are here for them. We will serve our citizens with purpose, compassion, and kindness.

We will take care of our own, in attitude and action. We will come to our brother's aid when he is down or makes a mistake, not spite him.
